ARE YOU AWARE OF NOVA SCOTIA BILLING CODES 3.03E & 3.04C?

These are billing codes that allow you to bill for additional time during visits and yearly health checks for patients with intellectual and developmental disabilities, who benefit from periodic health checks and longer appointment times.

PHYSICIAN BILLING CODES

3.03E

"The care of adults with developmental disabilities" provides additional time during visits

3.04C

"Adults with developmental disabilities complete examination" provides more time during annual

physical exams
